Section 4. First aid measures

Description of necessary first aid measures

Eye contact

Inhalation

: Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If it is suspected that fumes are still present, the rescuer should wear an appropriate mask or self-contained breathing apparatus. If not breathing, if breathing is irregular or if respiratory arrest occurs, provide artificial respiration or oxygen by trained personnel. Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

Alternatively, or if water-insoluble, absorb with an inert dry material and place in an appropriate waste disposal container. Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor.

Large spill

Section 7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling

Protective measures

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Section 8. Exposure controls/personal protection

Appropriate engineering controls

: Use only with adequate ventilation.
